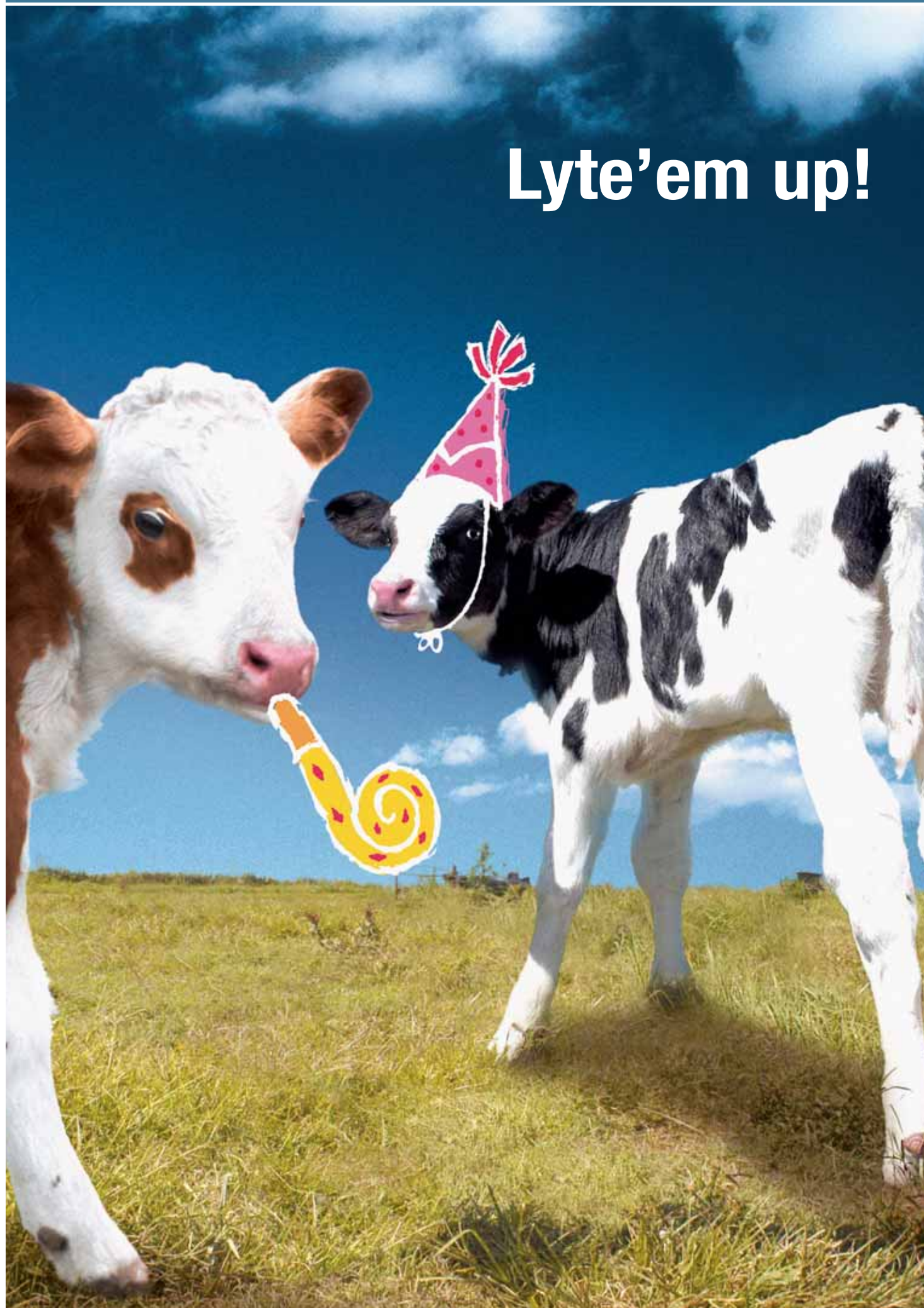






## Dosing and usage guidelines. Treatment recommendation for one day.



Lyte'em up!

CALF APPEARANCE	Dehydration (%)	Total daily fluid requirement milk + water + <b>Calf-Lyte*</b>	Recommended dose of <b>Calf-Lyte*</b>	Comments
<b>Standing: alert</b> Skin tent: less than 5 seconds Good suckling reflex 	Mild Up to 5%	4-6 liters	2-4 liters <b>Calf-Lyte</b> orally (1-2 feedings)	If no improvement is seen in 2-3 days, consult veterinarian
<b>Standing: depressed</b> Skin tent: 6-7 seconds Decreased or no suckling reflex. Eyeballs slightly sunk: less than 5 mm 	Moderate 6 to 8%	6-8 liters	4-6 liters <b>Calf-Lyte</b> orally (2-3 feedings) Veterinary suggested 1 liter <b>Calf-Lyte Solution</b> intravenous	Watch the calf closely. If no improvement in 10-14 hours, veterinary intervention is required. If suckling reflex is absent, <b>Calf-Lyte Solution</b> intravenous application and drenching are necessary.
<b>Lying on chest: severely depressed</b> Skin tent: more than 7 seconds No suckling reflex. Eyeballs deeply sunk: more than 5 mm Cold mouth, ears and legs 	Severe 9 to 11%	8-10 liters	Veterinary intervention required 1-2 liters <b>Calf-Lyte Solution</b> intravenous 4-6 liters <b>Calf-Lyte</b> orally (2-3 feedings)	Administer oral fluids by drench
<b>Lying on side: comatose</b> 	Critical Over 12%	As indicated by veterinarian	Vet intervention required Treatment as indicated by veterinarian

# CALF-LYTE

**CALF APPEARANCE NEEDS TO BE REEVALUATED AND FLUID NEEDS HAVE TO BE DETERMINED ON A DAILY BASIS.**

Skin tent: Made by pinching a fold of skin, then releasing and recording the time taken for the skin to return to normal.  
 Eyeball recession: Gap between the eye and the socket, creates an impression of “dullness of eye”.
